How to Register

- Choose a camp or retreat experience. Select your choice(s) of week(s) to attend. Write your choice(s) in the area of the registration form showing three event lines. Beneath these lines, please put in your choice(s) for alternate camps in case your first choice(s) is/are full. Please make a copy of the registration form for yourself.
- 2. **Send in a \$50 nonrefundable registration fee** for each camp chosen with your registration (not applicable for spring youth weekend). The remainder of the cost is due three weeks prior to your camp week unless you have made other arrangements with the camp registrar.
- 3. Talk with your church/agency to see if they have camp scholarships available. If they do, please supply that information to us on the registration form. If payments are being made on your behalf, please be sure they include your name and the name of the camp program you are attending on any check or paperwork.
- 4. Camp fees, except registration fees, are refundable for nonparticipants who notify the camp registrar at least three weeks before the camp begins.
- 5. Confirmation packets will be mailed to campers in early April (first round). <u>Please open immediately.</u>
 The health history form needs to be filled out, signed, and sent back to camp as soon as possible.
 Because of COVID regulations, <u>we CANNOT accept any medical paperwork on the registration day</u> for your camp—<u>it must be turned in in advance.</u> (Health forms can also be found at mechuwana.org)

Arrival and Check-in for Camps

Arrival and check-in for all camps is on Sunday from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. Pick up for most camps is on Thursday. Mom/Child, First Timers, and Uniquely Us camps leave on Wednesday morning. Pick up for Elementary/Middle School Music Theatre camp is Friday evening after the camp's performance. Pick up for Middle School/Senior High Music Theatre camp is Saturday morning after the camp's performance.

Upon arrival for your camp, registration check-in will be in front of Memorial Chapel, except for Adult Special Needs Camp, which will have registration check-in in front of the Dining Commons.
